WHAT IF SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 ARE PRESENT?

Stay home if sick.

Do not come to school if you have a fever of 100.1 or higher

- Practice physical distancing.
- Practice good hand hygiene.
- Cover cough and sneezes.
- Wear cloth face coverings in public places. Mandatory in hallways if a case is reported in school
- Disinfect surfaces and objects regularly.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- The temperature will be taken of any student suspected to be ill.

YOU MAY DISCONTINUE SELF-ISOLATION WHEN:

- At least 3 days (72 hours) have passed since recovery defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement of respiratory symptoms (cough, shortness of breath)
- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

If you have been exposed make sure to self-isolate and call your health care provider.
