McKINNEY-VENTO ACT STATEMENT OF PARENT-STUDENT RIGHTS

This District is committed to providing an educational environment that treats all students with dignity and respect. Every student experiencing homelessness or transition shall have access to the same free and appropriate educational opportunities as students who are not homeless. This commitment to serve the educational rights of homeless children, youth, and unaccompanied youth, applies to all services, programs, and activities provided or made available by the District.

A student or unaccompanied youth may be considered eligible for services under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act if he or she is presently living:

- In temporary shared housing, a shelter, or transitional living program;
- In a hotel/motel, campground, or similar situation due to lack of alternatives;
- At a bus station, park, car, or abandoned building.

Eligible students under the McKinney-Vento Act have the right to the following:

- **Immediate enrollment**: documentation and immunization records cannot serve as a barrier to the enrollment in school;
- **School selection**: eligible students have a right to select from the following schools:
 - o The school he/she attended when permanently housed (School of Origin);
 - o The school in which he/she was last enrolled (School of Origin); or
 - The school in the attendance area in which the student currently resides (the School of Residency).
- **Remain enrolled** in his/her selected school for the duration of homelessness, or until the end of the academic year upon which they are permanently housed.
- **Participate in programs** for which they are eligible, including Title I tutoring programs; free lunch in schools with the National School Lunch Program; and Head Start and Even Start Preschool programs.
- **Transportation services**: a McKinney-Vento eligible student attending his/her School of Origin has a right to transportation to and from the School of Origin.
- **Dispute Resolution**: If you disagree with school officials about enrollment, transportation, or fair treatment of a homeless child or unaccompanied youth, you may file a complaint with the District. The District must respond and attempt to resolve the complaint promptly. During the dispute, the student must be immediately enrolled in the school and provided transportation until the matter is resolved. The District Liaison will assist you in explaining the decision, providing notice of any appeal process, and filling out dispute forms.

In addition:

- You may provide written or verbal communication(s) to support your position regarding the student's enrollment in the requested school. An appeal form is attached.
- You may contact the State Coordinator for Homeless Education at the Idaho State Department of Education if further help is needed or desired.
